<p>September 28th & 29th, 2022: Environmental Justice Workshops</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In person workshops, 35+ participants • 2 workshops- one in English, one in Spanish. • Workshops explored the City’s current EJ challenges related to pollution, water quality, and housing. The breakout portion of the meeting served as a brainstorm session to discuss community solutions. • Breakout Group Notes

<p>March 28th and 29th, 2023 Public Safety Workshops</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In person workshops, 70 participants. • Two workshops- one in Spanish (with English translation) and one in English (with Spanish Translation) • Workshop began with a Welcome Activity that asked attendees to complete the following sentence: “A safe community is...” As attendees made their way to their seats, they were separated into tables where small group discussions would take place. The meeting was then started with a presentation about Public Safety. Attendees were presented with a draft of the city’s Public Safety goals. The second part of the meetings had the attendees answer three questions regarding Public Safety and the presentation they just saw. <p>April 19th, 26th and 27th, 2023: Housing Element Workshops</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In-person workshops, 60+ participants • 3 workshops- two in English with Spanish translation (one with Mixteco translation) and one in Spanish with English translation. • The first 30 min of the meeting, participants had the opportunity to visit 6 stations, one for each of the Housing Element goals, ask questions and provide feedback. Each station was supported by bilingual staff. The second part of the meeting included a presentation and ended with a Q&A portion. Following the Q&A, participants had a second opportunity to visit the 6 stations and add additional feedback.
